

Managing The Beef Herd Planning... to capture opportunities

The past six or seven years has seen many challenges for beef cattle producers. Drought forced liquidation of herds at low prices while having to buy feed at record high levels. We also saw cattle numbers drop to near record low numbers. These record low numbers of cattle helped push cattle prices to all time high prices. Of course these record prices did not last nearly long enough. We quickly rebuilt cattle numbers and saw prices plummet. We did see a brief recovery in prices in the past year, but it was not long lived. With the volatile cattle market we have to make informed and wise decisions in our management programs and marketing programs. Nutrition is a major expense in all cow/calf operations. Many questions arise when it comes to nutrition. What can I feed? What is the best value for my operation? How much do I need to feed? How do I know the cost of my feeding program? Is hay my best option? Are bulk commodities an option? Other challenges include herd health concerns, including the latest on Trichomoniasis. Culling Bulls and Cows? Nutritional needs for different classes of cattle (heifers, 1st calf heifers, mature cows, etc.) How body condition and body weight determine nutritional needs? How quality of hay effects nutrition?

Directions to Camp Cooley Ranch from Franklin

From red light on Hwy 79 in Franklin go East on Hwy 79 for 10.8 miles, Turn left on Rolke Ranch Rd (CR 372). Follow for 4 miles to Camp Cooley entry gate. Continue 1.4 miles on Camp Cooley Rd. Take a right on Sale Barn Rd. Continue about .3 miles to Sale Barn on right. Parking is on the left.

Directions to Camp Cooley Ranch from Marquez

From the intersection of Hwy 7 and Hwy 79 in Marques, travel West on Hwy 79 for 7.9 miles to Holly Cemetery Road. Take a right on Holly Cemetery Road and continue 1.9 miles to Varvel Road and take a left. Continue .5 miles to Camp Cooley Rd. Take a right and continue 2 miles on Camp Cooley Road to Sale Barn Rd. Take a right on Sale Barn Road and continue about .3 miles to Sale Barn on the right. Parking is on the left.

Directions to Camp Cooley Ranch from North of the Ranch

From the intersection of Hwy 7 and FM 979 continue South on FM 979 3.5 miles to FM 2096. Take a left on FM 2096 and continue for 2.3 miles to Cole Branch Road on the Left. Take a left on Cole Branch Road and continue .7 miles to Camp Cooley Road. Take a Right on Camp Cooley Road and continue 2.8 miles to Sale Barn Road on the Left. Turn on Sale Barn Road and continue .3 miles. The Sale Barn is on the right and parking is on the left.
